Task 1: What is citing?

Answer: Citing is the way you tell your readers that certain material in your work came from another source, and gives the readers information necessary to find that source again. (0:14-0:38)

Task 3: List the requirements of a cover page in APA style.

Answer: The cover page includes

- page number (in the header and right-aligned OR right upper corner)
- title of the paper (centred and bolded)
- student name (first and last)
- name of institution
- course code and course name
- professor's name
- date assignment is due

Task 4: List the requirements of the first page in MLA style.

Answer: There is no separate cover page for MLA style. The first page has the student's name, professor's name, course code, and date in the top left corner. This is followed by the title of the paper (centered). The paper begins on the next line (indented and double spaced). (8:31)

Task 5: List the two places a reference must be cited.

Answer: Citing in APA and MLA requires both in-text citations and a reference list at the end of the paper (9:24).

Task 6: What is paraphrasing?

Answer: Paraphrasing is using your own words to describe an author's idea (10:04).
