Task 1a: Calculate the total cost of payment option 1 for single, double, and trio rooms.

Answer:

Single: \$8,354 + \$2,564 = \$10,918 Double: \$7,298 + \$2,564 = \$9,862 Trio: \$5,125 + \$2,564 = \$7,689

Task 1b: Calculate the amount of money saved if a student chooses a trio room compared to a double room.

Answer: Trio vs. Double: \$9,862 - \$7,689 = \$2,173 savings

Task 2a: Calculate the total cost of a trio room for payment options 1, 2 and 3.

Answer:

Option 1: \$5,125 + \$2,564 = \$7,689Option 2: \$4,000 + \$1,282 + \$1,225 + \$1,282 = \$7,789Option 3: \$1,500 + \$1,282 + \$3,200 + \$1,282 + \$550 = \$7,814

Task 2b: Calculate the amount of money saved when choosing option 1 instead of option 3.

Answer: \$7,814 - \$7,689 = \$125 savings

- key controlled bedroom door
- visitors sign in at the front desk and provide photo identification
- common areas, stairwells, entrances and corridors are videomonitored
- front-desk staff are on duty 24-hours a day
