## **Understand Types of Questions Asked in Interviews**

When going to an interview for a potential job opportunity you will be asked many questions. These will likely include work history, wages, and the company you are applying to, qualifications and questions about you. The best approach is to be prepared for these questions and other questions that may come up.

Examples of questions and topics often discussed in interviews are listed below.

## Work History

- Where you worked, your position and dates of employment
- Questions about your resume
- Why you are leaving or have left your position

#### About You

- Greatest strengths and weaknesses
- Do you work well with other people?
- What motivates you?

## Qualifications

- Describe the skills that fit into the new position
- Describe your work style
- How many hours do you normally work

• Salary expectations

# Company ABC

- Why do you want to work here?
- What do you know about ABC COMPANY?
