If hands are visibly soiled:



Wet hands with warm water and apply soap.
- 

2

Clean all surfaces, palms, backs of each hand, fingertips, between fingers, and bases of thumbs for at least 15 seconds.
- 

3

Rinse hands with water and pat dry with a paper towel.
- 

4

Turn off the tap using a paper towel.

If hands are not visibly soiled:

Apply 1-2 full pumps of product onto one palm.
- 

2

Spread the product over all surfaces of hands.
- 

3

Rub palms, backs of each hand, fingertips, between fingers, and bases of thumbs for at least 15 seconds.
- 

4








Rub hands until the product is dry.

How to:
Put On Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- 1 Perform Hand Hygiene**
Use alcohol-based hand rub, or soap and water if hands are visibly soiled.

- 2 Put on Gown**
Tie at neck and waist.

- 3 Put on Mask / N95 Respirator**

Secure ties, loops or straps and mould metal piece over nose.

Perform a seal check for N95 respirators.
- 4 Put on Protective Eyewear**

Place eye protection over face and eyes and adjust to fit.

- 5 Put on Gloves**
Pull glove over the cuff of the gown.





