- A club is a gathering around a common interest, activity or hobby to engage with others who share this interest; a community is a gathering to create a sense of belonging or promote wellness.
- A club must be open to all students on campus.
- A club may apply for funding and have access to marketing, banking and event software; a community may not apply for funding.
- A club may host events; communities may not host events but may suggest events and activities.

Answer: Classes or programs involved in fundraising for field trips, socials, graduation or academic requirements cannot be considered for club funding.
