1. Electronic devices
- phones, FM or two-way radios



6. Inability to measure impairment
- e.g. drug tests



2. Fatigue
- long work hours



7. Multi-tasking in the cab
- using two-way radio, calling in mileage



3. Not appreciating distracting factors
- become dulled to over time, poor road conditions



8. No clear policies
- e.g. communication and reinforcement



4. Lack of contact with supervisor
- isolated, independent work environment



9. Inexperienced commercial workers
- contract or new drivers, new to bush roads



5. Substance use
- alcohol, drugs



10. Not following rules willingly
- speeding, load management
