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Answer Key

Task 1: Why would someone be charged a late filing penalty?

If you owe income tax and do not file a T1 return on time.

Task 2: What are the charges for a late filing penalty?

5% of the balance owing and 1% of balance owing for each month you are late to a maximum of 12 months

Task 3: What are the charges for failing to report income?

10% of the amount not reported and 50% of tax attributed to the omission for gross negligence (knowingly omitting the amount)
