People who are interested in a career in the skilled trades but don't have the skills or experience to get a job as an apprentice can apply for pre-apprenticeship training. Scan the "Pre-apprenticeship training" information.

Pre-apprenticeship training

If you're interested in working in a trade but don't have the skills or experience to get a job as an apprentice, you have the option to apply for pre-apprenticeship training.

How it works

You can get this training through different organizations, such as colleges or community agencies, across Ontario.

It's free – costs for textbooks, safety equipment and tools are also covered.

The training goes for up to 52 weeks and starts at different times throughout the year.

You can receive:

- safety training for skilled trades
- training to improve your academic skills
- basic level apprenticeship in-school training

Pre-apprenticeship training also includes a work placement for **eight to 12 weeks**.

How to qualify

There are programs for youth or adults who:

- graduated from high school
- left before finishing high school
- are unemployed or underemployed (age and eligibility for Employment Insurance are not considered)
- are Indigenous, newcomers to Canada, women, Francophone or youth-at-risk

How to apply

You can search for pre-apprenticeship training near you – then apply directly to the organization offering it.
