Task 4: How much is the cost difference between the Rent to Own and the Electronics Store's 5 Cu Ft Chest Freezer?

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Notes for instructors/facilitators:

Always use the learner's math from the previous task in the set to mark the next task, as it is about understanding the calculations and just because one number/answer is incorrect it doesn't mean the next one is automatically wrong just because the numbers used were wrong previously.

Also, important to remember that when dealing with per cents you can have a 1 cent difference in HST amounts dependent on how the math is completed.

Answer Key

Task 1: Calculate the total cost of the 5 Cu Ft Chest Freezer from the Rent to Own store.

A: $\$9 \times 156 \text{ weeks} = 1404.00$

Task 2: Calculate the total cost of the 5 Cu Ft Chest Freezer from the Rent to Own store including HST.

A: $1404 \times 0.13 = 182.52$ $1404.00 + 182.52 = \$1586.52$

Task 3: How much is the total cost of the 5 Cu Ft Chest Freezer from the Electronics Store including HST.

A: $248 \times 0.13 = 32.24$ $248.00 + 32.24 = \$280.24$

Task 4: How much is the cost difference between the Rent to Own and the Electronics Store's 5 Cu Ft Chest Freezer.

A: $1586.52 - 280.24 = 1306.28$

Task 5: Calculate how many 5 Cu Ft Chest Freezers from the Electronic Store someone could have bought with the total amount of money spent on the 5 Cu Ft Chest Freezer at the Rent to Own Store?

A: $1586.52 / 280.24 = 5.66$ (accept 5 as well)
